Day 2 Brings Renewed Hope at World Club ProAm

The tranquil setting of Umhlali Country Club on the KwaZulu-Natal North Coast welcomed local and international PGA club teams to Day 2 of the PGA of South Africa | Mercedes-Benz World Club ProAm. At the end of the day's play, the general consensus from the teams was that a more forgiving round of golf had been enjoyed compared to that of Day 1. An air of confidence and renewed hopes of the grand prize emerged as the scores were logged.

In the ProAm 4-Ball Alliance, South Africa maintained the lead and held 8 out of the 10 top spots. Blue Valley Golf Club and Windsor Park finished in a tied 1st place on 174 points with The Crete Golf Club from Greece moving up the field into 3rd place on 173 points.

In the Professional Individual Stableford, Henrik Engdahll from Crete Golf Club in Greece moved from 2nd place up to 1st by finishing on 73 points. One shot behind in tied 2nd place on 72 points is yesterday's leader, Aaron Cox from Caboolture Golf Club in Australia with Chad Ayres from Hillcrest Golf Club in America and Steve Basson from Omeya Golf Club in Namibia.

The best round of the day was played by Steve Basson, from Omeya Club, who conquered the course on an impressive 38 points. Day 3 of the tournament moves inland to Cotswold Downs Golf Course.

The runner-up, third and through to the tenth finishing 4-balls all win permissible prizes.

The entry includes a full golfing package, plus seven nights 4-star accommodation sharing, meals and three 5-star gala events.
